Training includes five weeks of classroom instruction and one hands-on workshop day, totaling 36 hours.

This class will be offered two evenings a week for five weeks at the Black Forest Fire Station. Then a one day, hands-on training workshop on Saturday, Oct. 15 in tree identification, insect & disease diagnostics, tree pruning, planting forest management & fire behavior.

Classes begin on Monday, Sept. 12, 2016 and will be held every Monday & Tuesday evening from 6 – 9 p.m. through Oct. 11, 2016 with a field day on Saturday, Oct. 15 at the Black Forest Fire Station
